

Funding in the amount of \$16,000,000 would provide for a single consolidated facility for Soldier Readiness Processing (SRP) activities for deploying units at Fort Hood. The existing SRP complex was the site of the November 5, 2009 shootings that claimed numerous victims and forced dispersal of SRP functions throughout the installation. SRP validates the readiness of each soldier for deployment and is therefore a vital element of projecting U.S. military force to theaters of conflict. Ft. Hood has sent more soldiers to Iraq & Afghanistan than any other US installation. In addition, the existing site remains stigmatized by this tragic event of national significance and does not provide an environment conducive to soldier well-being. This project is urgently needed to consolidate SRP activities into a single, efficient facility, and therefore meets an important war-related requirement.



Providence Emergency Management Agency (PEMA) Emergency Operations Center Expansion, \$750,000 – FEMA, State and Local Programs/Emergency Operations Center

Rhode Island Emergency Management Agency (RIEMA), Flooding Disaster Assistance, Notwithstanding any other provision of law, including any agreement, the Federal share of assistance, including direct Federal assistance provided under sections 403, 406, and 407 of the Robert T. Stafford Disaster Relief and Emergency Assistance Act (42 U.S.C. 5140b, 5172, and 5173), for damages resulting from FEMA-3311-EM-RI and FEMA-1894-DR, shall not be less than 90 percent of the eligible costs under such sections.
